What to do with your waste



Curbside Recycling

Many local companies offer subscription curbside recycling pickup at your home on a weekly basis. Acceptable materials are placed in a single container provided by the company. Contact your current garbage service provider to see if they offer recycling services. If not, recycling-only services are available in the Lincoln area.



Public Recycling Drop-off Sites

Recyclables can be sorted at home and taken to a public drop-off site. Most sites are open 24/7. Locations and materials accepted can be found on the back page of this guide.



Garbage Collection

Waste hauling companies offer weekly garbage collection along with recycling and grass and leaf collection services. Contact the Lincoln Solid Waste and Recycling Association at 402-475-8360 to find the waste hauler that serves your area.

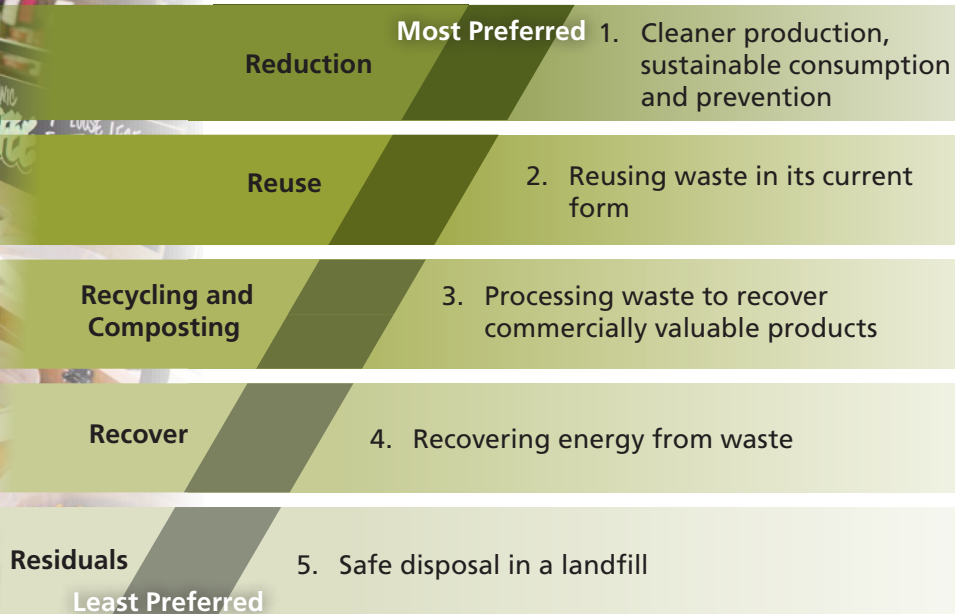
If you don't need it, don't buy it!

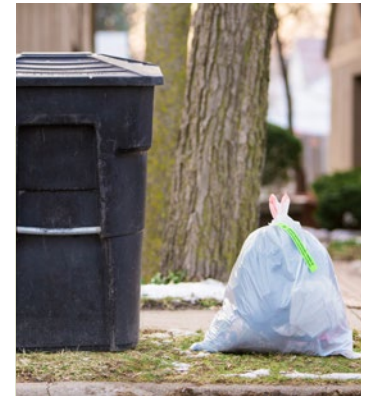

Haulers Helping Homeless

To recycle used clothing, shoes, purses and textiles right from your home, gather your items in a plastic garbage bag and tag it with a "Haulers Helping Homeless" tag that you can pick up from any Russ's Market, Hy-Vee or Super Saver location. Leave your bags on the curb on the same day your waste is collected, and your hauler will take them to the People's City Mission, where they will be used to help the homeless! Contact your waste hauler for more information.

Worn out clothes and textiles (such as sheets and towels) with stains, tears or just hopelessly out of style can be repurposed into rags as long as they are **clean** (laundered), **dry** and **odorless**. Take them to any clothing donation box, Goodwill or People's City Mission.

Plastic Grocery Bags

Plastic bags are readily recyclable but should not be deposited at recycling drop off sites or in curbside recycling bins. Plastic film can gum-up sorting equipment, causing delays and adding costs to the sorting process. If you have plastic film such as plastic bags, dry cleaning bags, bread bags, wraps from paper towels, bathroom tissue and napkins, diaper bags or newspaper bags, take them to the following retailers: Hy-Vee, Leon's Food Mart, Lowe's, Russ's Market, Target, Walmart and Super Saver stores.

Is It hazardous?

Read the label and look for:

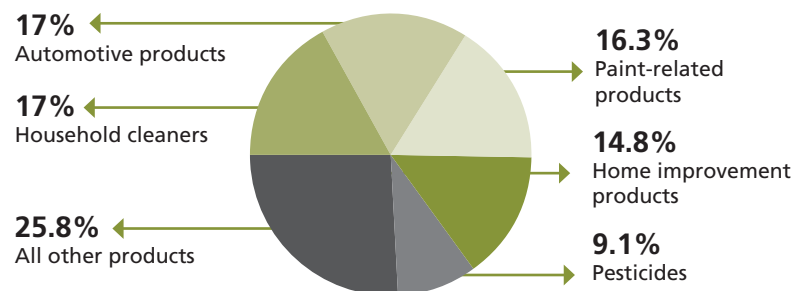
Keywords: danger, caution, warning, poison, flammable, toxic

Phrases: keep out of reach of children, harmful if swallowed, causes burns

Instructions: Care, use, handling, storage, protective equipment, first aid

Product Focus

Pesticides

Pesticides are chemicals that discourage or kill pests such as insects and rodents. While effective, pesticides can be toxic to humans. Consider less toxic alternatives when managing pests:

- Verify the need: seeing one pest does not mean you have a problem.
- Keep it clean: don't provide the food, water and shelter pests need to live.
- Prevent access: seal cracks, holes and other entry points to your home.
- Get physical: use barriers, traps, vacuums and other non-chemical means to remove pests.
- Last resort: use chemicals only if the above strategies fail. Be sure to read and follow label instructions and use only what you need.



Mercury-containing Products

Mercury is a neurotoxin that can harm human health and the environment. Mercury-containing products found in the home include lighting products (CFLs, light tubes), old thermostats and thermometers and elemental mercury. To reduce the risks associated with mercury:

- Purchase less-toxic alternatives like LED lights or alcohol-based thermometers.
- Recycle or properly dispose of mercury at a household hazardous waste collection (See page 9).

Yard Waste Management

From April 1 to December 1, grass and leaves cannot be mixed with regular garbage.

- Subscribe to a separate collection with your refuse hauler.
- Mulch grass clippings on your lawn or compost grass and leaves in your backyard.
- Take grass and leaves to the N. 48th Street Transfer Station (do not leave bags and containers).
- Tree trimmings, garden waste and weeds can go in regular garbage. Tree branches should be cut and bundled to certain lengths.

LinGRO Compost

You can enjoy the benefits of healthier soil, even if you don't compost. LinGRO Compost can be used as a soil amendment. It's recommended that one inch of compost be mixed with four to six inches of soil. This decreases the density of the soil and increases water infiltration as well as its nutrient content. It also adds organic matter and beneficial microorganisms to the soil. LinGRO Compost is available to the public on a first-come, first-served basis. Call 402-441-8215 for more information.



Organic Waste Composting Opportunities



In 2015, Lincoln Public Schools (LPS) started an organic waste composting program in 13 school cafeterias. Compostable food containers and utensils, food waste, milk cartons, napkins and other non-recyclable paper products are sent to Prairieland Dairy for composting. These schools are diverting over 2,325 pounds of organic waste per day from the landfill, while recycling and composting an average of 51 percent of their total waste generated. With a grant from the City Public Works and Utilities Department, the pilot will be expanded to nine more schools in 2016. Acceptable: Inserts/ads are OK.
Not Acceptable: No other paper. No plastic bags.



Corrugated cardboard and paperboard packaging

Acceptable: Flatten cardboard and paperboard (i.e. cereal boxes).
Not Acceptable: No packing material. No waxed cardboard.

Aluminum and Tin

Acceptable: Rinse, clean and flatten aluminum and tin cans.
Not Acceptable: No other metal products. No aluminum foil.



Glass bottles and jars

Acceptable: All food and beverage glass. Green, brown and clear glass. Labels are OK. Rinse clean.
Not Acceptable: No drinking glasses. No window glass. No light bulbs.



Plastic #1 through #5 containers

Acceptable: All #1 through #5 plastic bottles and containers. Labels are OK. Rinse clean.
Not Acceptable: No motor oil containers. No plastic toys. No plastic #6 or #7 containers. No styrofoam. No plastic lawn chemical bottles.



Residential mixed paper

Acceptable: Mail, magazines, office and school paper, telephone directories and shredded paper.
Not Acceptable: No tissue paper. No milk cartons or juice boxes. No paper plates. No newspaper.
